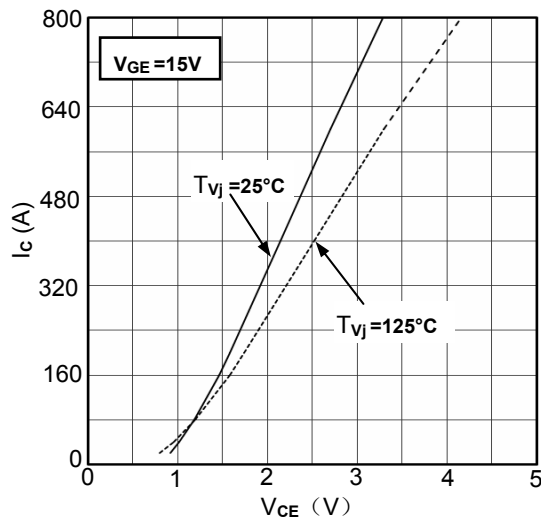


Figure1. Typical Output Characteristics

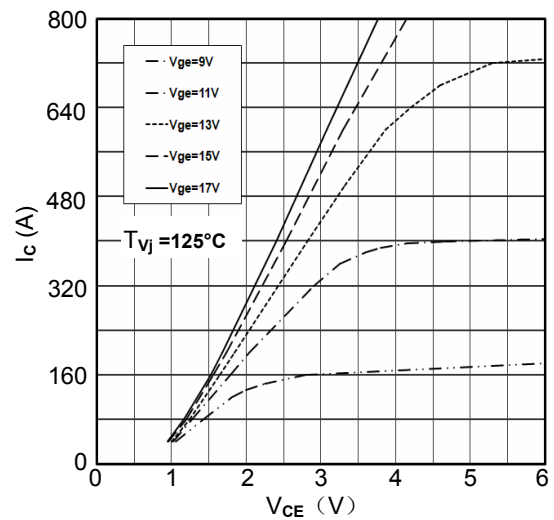


Figure2. Typical Output Characteristics

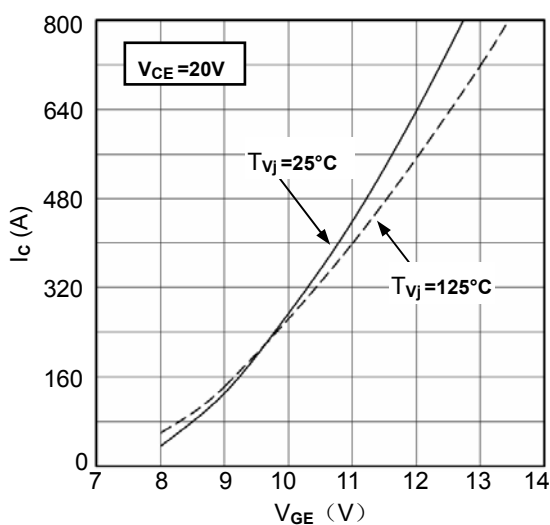


Figure3. Typical Transfer characteristics

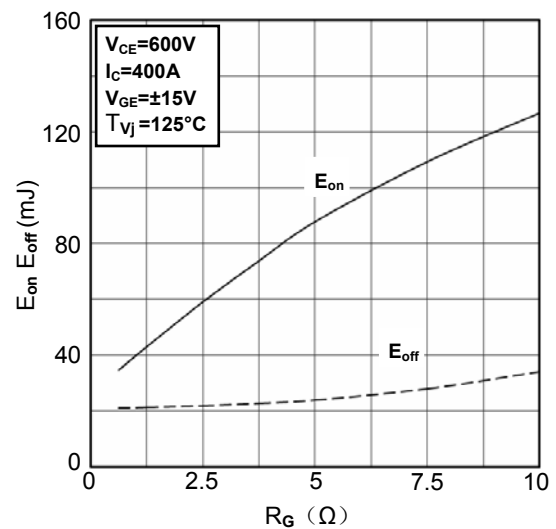


Figure4. Switching Energy vs. Gate Resistor

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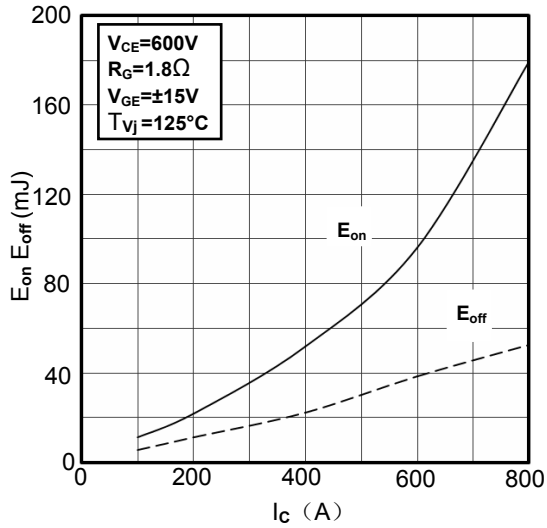


Figure 5. Switching Energy vs. Collector Current

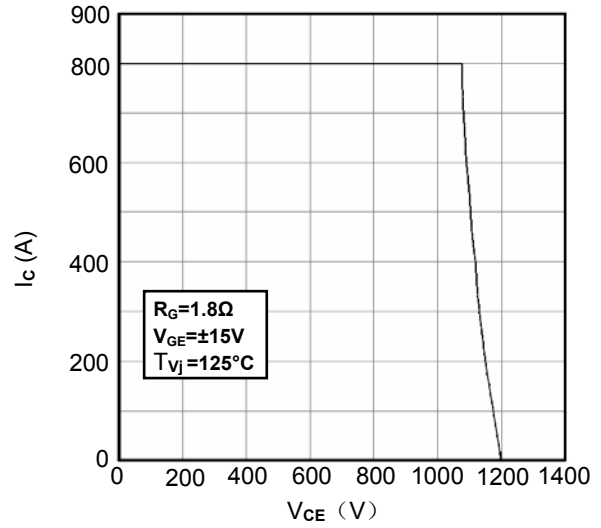


Figure 6. Reverse Biased Safe Operating Area

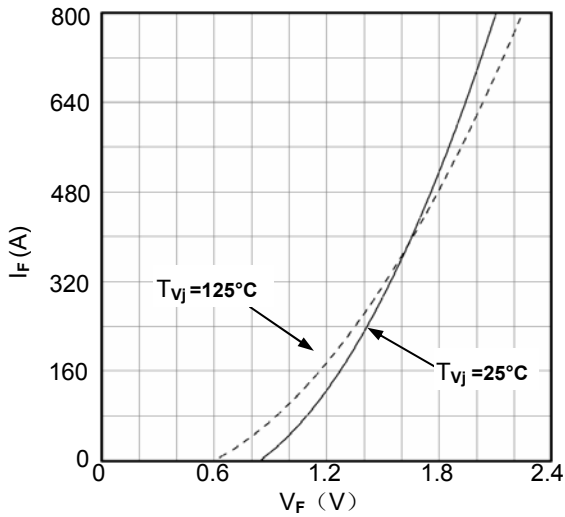


Figure 7. Diode Forward Characteristics

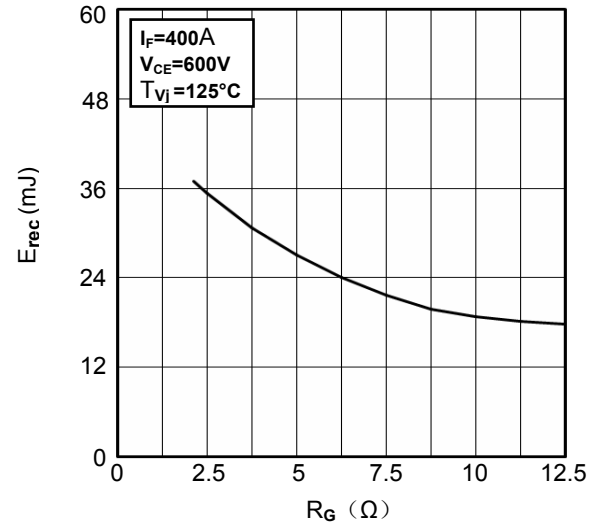


Figure 8. Switching Energy vs. Gate Resistor

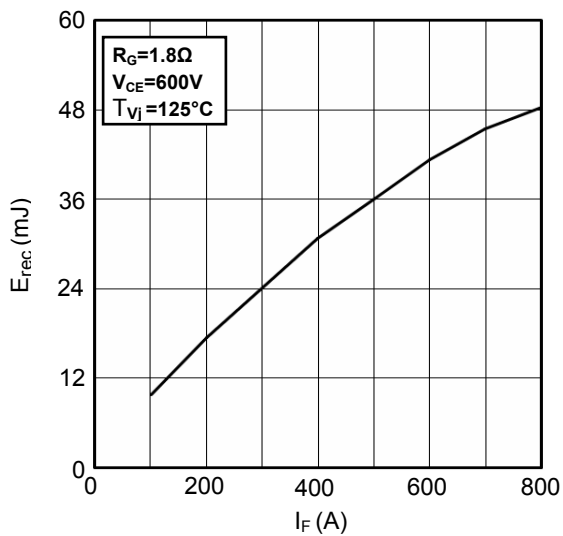


Figure 9. Switching Energy vs. Forward Current

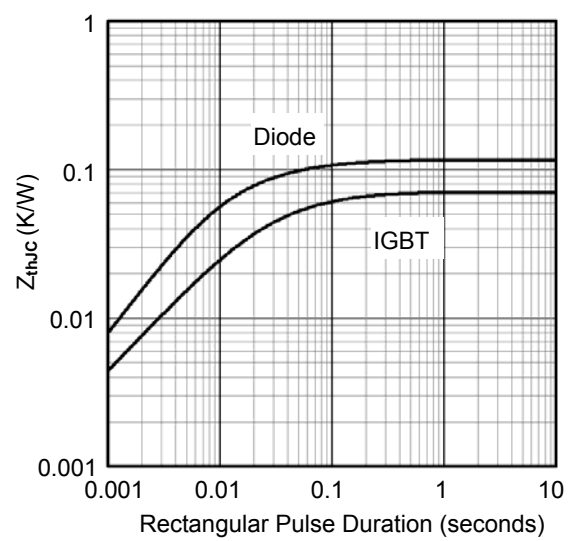


Figure 10. Transient Thermal Impedance
